VILLA SALETTA

A story spanning centuries

The estate has been owned by just four families throughout its history with documented winemaking traditions going back to 980AD. Beginning with the Gambacorta family in the 14th century, then notably the Riccardi family, bankers to the powerful house of Medici, then the Castelli Family, and lastly in 2000 to the Hands family. By then the estate had almost entirely fallen to ruin, however we saw the potential to combine traditional Tuscan techniques and modern technology, but always grounded in the heritage of the estate.

CHIAVE DI SALETTA 2016 | £48

Powerful notes of berries and dark chocolate with balsamic notes and spicy sensations. An elegant wine with a fine length and persistence and velvety tannins.

CHIANTI SUPERIORE 2016 | £45

A full, intense aroma with floral and red fruit notes. Fresh, smooth and well balanced with a complex consistency, recalling hints of violets, vanilla and smoke.

SALETTA RICCARDI 2018 | £85 | £22

Aromas of leather, tobacco, ripe red fruit and quinine. The palate is savoury, full and ample with silky tannins and a long and persistent finish, making this wine a bold expression of the estate's terroir and showcases Sangiovese at its best.

SALETTA GIULIA 2018 | £85

Spice, toasted oak and aromas of berries, liquorice and violets lead to a full palate with a deliciously jammy aftertaste of ripe red berries. A modern Bordeaux style blend of 55% Cabernet Franc and 45% Cabernet Sauvignon that boasts an impressive finish.

980AD - MAGNUM 2015 | £450

This multi-award-winning wine was recently awarded decanter Best in Show. A rich nose with aromas of cherries, raspberries, blueberries, cassis and wild forest fruits. The palate adds black pepper, vanilla, liquorice, and rosemary. Elegant, with velvety tannins with a very long finish.

BRUNO PAILLARD

A partnership and a friendship

Hand Picked Hotels and Bruno Paillard have been firm friends since 2001. The quality and elegance of the champagnes shows the passion and commitment of Bruno and Alice to bring us distinctive and refined cuvées.

Creating a new Champagne Maison in 1981 might have seemed like a moment of madness in a region that had not seen a new house in nearly a century, with a conservative attitude, however, was in a rented cellar and with grapes bought from carefully selected wine growers that Brunos first champagnes were born. Alice Paillard joined her father in 2007, then in 2018 she took over the management of the business.

Working organically with many sustainable practices in place, the Maison remains fully independent, and family owned and run today, just like Hand Picked Hotels.
